Verint Engage 2022 Covid-19 Policy

What are the COVID-related safety protocols and requirements for Verint Engage 2022?

COVID-19 Requirements: Verint Engage will proceed with a "**Right of Entry**" approach for all attendees, exhibitors, speakers, and Verint staff. Verint wants to ensure a safe and comfortable experience for all participants. With that in mind, Verint has developed its overall health and safety requirements, including the Right of Entry policy, with consideration for prevailing public health guidance, legal guidelines and industry practices, and with specific consideration of relevant Florida regulations.

The Right of Entry policy allows an attendee to show validation of their vaccine status as "fully vaccinated" (**Option A**), or to show proof of a negative COVID-19 test taken within forty-eight (48) hours of registration (**Option B**); whichever is their preference. Any attendee that receives a positive COVID-19 test result or any illness symptoms within forty-eight (48) hours prior to Verint Engage will be required to refrain from attending. Attendees may choose, but are not required, to wear face masks, based on the individual attendee's comfort level.

In order to register on-site for Verint Engage, each attendee, exhibitor, speaker, and Verint staff member will be required to complete one of the following processes:

Option A – Provide Proof of Vaccination:

• Present proof of vaccination validation, along with government-issued ID, to a Verint authorized representative at registration.

For the purposes of Option A, at this time, a person is considered **fully vaccinated**: fourteen (14) days after their second dose in a two-dose series, such as the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines, or fourteen (14) days after a single-dose vaccine, such as the Johnson & Johnson vaccine. For international attendees, COVID-19 vaccines authorized for emergency use by the World Health Organization (i.e., AstraZeneca/Oxford, Covishield, Sinopharm, and Sinovac) or in compliance with local guidance and/or requirements in the home country of the attendee is acceptable.

Option B – Provide Negative COVID Test Result:

- Step 1: Obtain a negative COVID-19 test result through a local pharmacy, medical provider, or other licensed testing provider within forty-eight (48) hours of registration. Self-administered or at-home test results will be accepted.
- Step 2: Present proof of negative COVID test verification, along with government-issued ID, to a Verint authorized representative at registration.

For the purposes of Option B, any attendee unable to provide a negative COVID-19 test result at registration will be afforded the option to obtain COVID-19 testing on-site. The on-site testing will be free of charge to any attendee and a Verint authorized representative will be on-site to coordinate the testing.

All attendees must comply with the Right of Entry policy. Verint will not be collecting or maintaining information about vaccination status or COVID test results. Any attendee that receives a positive COVID-19 test result or any illness symptoms during the conference will be subject to the policies of the Hyatt Regency Orlando in Orlando, Florida, if registered and requirements are in place, or the CDC guidelines if not registered. Further, Verint may share any COVID-related information received by the attendees directly as part of the Right of Entry policy with public health authorities or other regulatory agencies, as required under applicable laws. Attendees assume all risks associated with, resulting from, or arising in connection with, attendance at and/or participation, in any capacity, in Verint Engage and any Verint Engage-related activities, including, without limitation, all risks of illness or sickness (including those caused by known or unknown infectious or communicable disease such as COVID).

Verint will continue to monitor developments and reserves the right to revise these requirements at any time at its sole discretion, without liability, based on then-applicable circumstances, including, but not limited to, any updated guidance from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and federal, state, or local governments.
